- **Taxi:** On Arrivals Level 2, International Terminal
- **Taxi Fare:** To the Brisbane Convention Centre from the Airport: Approximately \$37 - \$40 plus a \$2 fee for departing taxis only.
- **Airtrain:** An all-weather bridge links station to arrivals and departures levels at both the International and Domestic Terminals and operates from the South Brisbane train station which is adjacent to the Convention Centre.
- **Airtrain Fare:** To South Brisbane station from International Terminal: Approximately \$13.00, 30 minutes. The train stops directly behind the Convention Centre at South Brisbane station.

- 1. GOMA – Gallery of Modern Art – South Bank**  
Brand new gallery at South Bank is currently holding an exhibition of Pablo Picasso's personal art collection until 14 September.
- 2. The Brisbane Powerhouse and New Farm Park – New Farm**  
Renovated power station turned arts centre. Built on the river in 1926 the Powerhouse regularly hosts an array of different art, comedy and music events. Until the 30th June, the Brisbane Powerhouse will be holding the 51st Annual World Press Photo Exhibition which profiles the globe's top press photographers and the world's best press photos of 2007.
- 3. Boundary Street – West End**  
Funky bars, cafes, and multicultural restaurants just a quick walk from South Bank.
- 4. Catch a City Cat – South Bank**  
Brisbane Ferry transport is a great relaxing way to get around Brisbane and enjoy the river and city views.
- 5. The Valley – Fortitude Valley**  
Bars, live music venues, clubs and restaurants. The Valley has always been at the centre of Brisbane's night life.
- 6. Brisbane City Centre – Brisbane**  
King George Square, City Hall, the Botanical Gardens, and Queen Street Mall are the main attractions to visit.
- 7. Kangaroo Point Cliffs – Kangaroo Point**  
Perfect spot for a barbeque on the river or a stroll along the river walkway.
- 8. Queensland Performing Arts Centre (QPAC) – Southbank**  
Theatre, opera, comedy and music - enquiries 13 6246.
- 9. Little Stanley Street – Southbank**  
Restaurants, bars and alfresco dining at Southbank.
- 10. The story Bridge Walk – Kangaroo Point**  
Climb the Storey Bridge and experience uninterrupted 360° views of Brisbane.
